

# District 6780 Humanitarian Grants

## 2011-12 Abbreviated Guidelines

### District Simplified Grants

Minimum project size - \$1000

Most common grant structure: Club provides minimum of \$500; no maximum. (Can be from club, individuals, other clubs, etc.) District matches up to \$2500. Multiple club DSG's can support larger projects.

Funds available in 2011-12: \$47,100 (Enough for about 29 clubs, or 19 typical projects)

Project can be local or international; must be humanitarian.

Restrictions:

- One grant per club per year
- Must be a new or expanded project
- No buildings, administrative expenses, international travel expenses or fundraisers
- Can't be a simple donation to another organization; must have Rotarian involvement

### Matching Grants

Minimum project size - \$10,000; larger projects are encouraged with better matching. Projects above \$50,000 have more hurdles and take more time to approve.

Most common grant structure: Clubs provide at least \$3500; Districts match club funds 1:1. World Fund matches District funds 1:1 and Club funds ½:1.

Funds available in 2011-12: \$60,000 in District Funds (about 10 typical projects); no limit on World Fund match is likely.

Project must be international and humanitarian. Two clubs in different countries must be involved.

Restrictions:

- No buildings, administrative expenses, international travel expenses or fundraisers
- Third-party support is OK, but the project can't be a simple donation to another organization
- Must have Rotarian involvement by both clubs – both financial support and project work
