Robert A. Stuart Jr. Past Director, RI

Bob is a partner in Brown Hay & Stephens which was founded by his great-great grandfather John Todd Stuart in 1828, the oldest law firm in the state of Illinois. He is a fellow of the American College of Trust and Estate Counsel and of the American Bar Foundation as well as advisor to Leading Lawyers Network. In Springfield, he has chaired the Chamber of Commerce, the United Way Campaign and the United Way Foundation. He is Vice President of the National Recreation Foundation, Vice president nominee of the Abraham Lincoln Association, and Trustee of the Illinois State Museum Society. Area President and past president of the Boy Scout Council, he holds the silver beaver and distinguished eagle awards. For service in masonry, he has been awarded the 33rd degree. The Illinois Association of Park Districts recently presented him its lifetime appreciation award.

Bob has been Rotary club president, district governor and one of 17 directors on the international board of Rotary International. He currently chairs RI's constitution and bylaws committee and is raising funds for Rotary's 7 global Peace Centers. He has immunized children in Rotary's campaign to eradicate polio, opened water wells, delivered wheelchairs, dedicated new schools following the Tsunami, and worked with clubs along the Gulf Coast in post Katrina relief efforts. The Rotary Foundation has given him its Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

Bob has served as trustee and elder in his church. Bob and his wife Margie live in Springfield, Illinois where their daughter Cori also resides and works.



General B. B. Bell, U.S. Army (ret.)

General B. B. Bell recently retired from the U.S. Army following a thirty nine year career. He received his commission through the University of Chattanooga ROTC program in 1969. General Bell served fifteen years deployed overseas in both peace and war. As a two star general, he commanded the Army's Armor Center at Ft. Knox, Kentucky, and later, as a three star general, the Army's Third Corps, headquartered at Ft. Hood, Texas. As a four star general, General Bell commanded the U.S. Army in Europe, as well as NATO's Land Component Headquarters in Heidelberg, Germany. Subsequently he served as the Commander of US Forces in Korea, as well as commander of all Allied forces in Korea. General Bell is a veteran of the Iraq Desert Storm Campaign where he served as General Schwarzkopf's Executive Officer, as well as the Balkans Campaigns in southern Europe. He is a lifetime member of the New York based Council on Foreign Relations, has a master's degree from the University of Southern California, and holds two honorary doctorate degrees. General Bell is married to the former Kathleen Fields of Chattanooga and they now reside in Ooltewah. They have one son, Buck, who lives in Tampa with his wife and daughter.

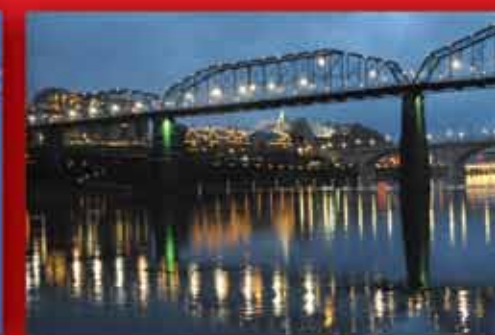

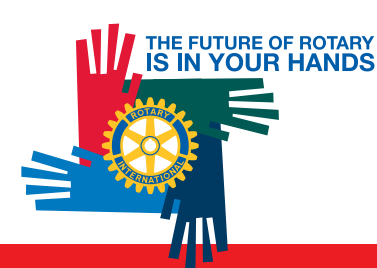
